READING

Please continue all the great work you've been doing at home to help improve your children's reading by trying to hear them read 4-5 times a week for around 10 minutes. We know it's not always easy and that every child is different so there may be many ways to approach supporting them. If you're finding it hard, please pop in or drop us an email and we'll help you find the best way to help them. It really makes such a huge difference and the one-to-one help that you can give them, especially in these early years, is invaluable.

HOMEWORK

All children seem to be enjoying working on Doodle for spelling and maths. It's a great way to help them consolidate their learning and it's also a good way for you to see what great progress they're making!

Handwriting however is still an assessed element of the English curriculum so it's just as important that the children can form their letters correctly and spell without the aid of digital support. The year 2s have already been handing in weekly spelling homework and now we are extending this to all the year one children. The tasks that are set are fun tasks that the children enjoy doing and shouldn't be onerous. They are focused on the spelling/ phonics sounds that are taught in class or individual words that are part of the common exception words that the children are expected to be able to spell by the end of the year. More information is in their spelling homework books so please read it carefully and support and encourage your child to do 5-10 minutes every night.
